2019 COMMUNITY INVESTMENT HIGHLIGHTS

Matson contributed over \$3.7 million in cash and in-kind services to support the work of 960 organizations across our service area.

CASH CONTRIBUTIONS: \$2,449,000

Notable donations included cash support to United Ways in Hawaii and on the U.S. mainland and support for both the American Heart Association and American Red Cross in key locations. The USO, Navy League and Coast Guard Foundation also received Matson's consistent support.

One-time urgent assistance was given to numerous Coast Guard Petty and Warrant Officers' Associations providing relief from their unpaid service during the 2018-2019 Federal Government shutdown.

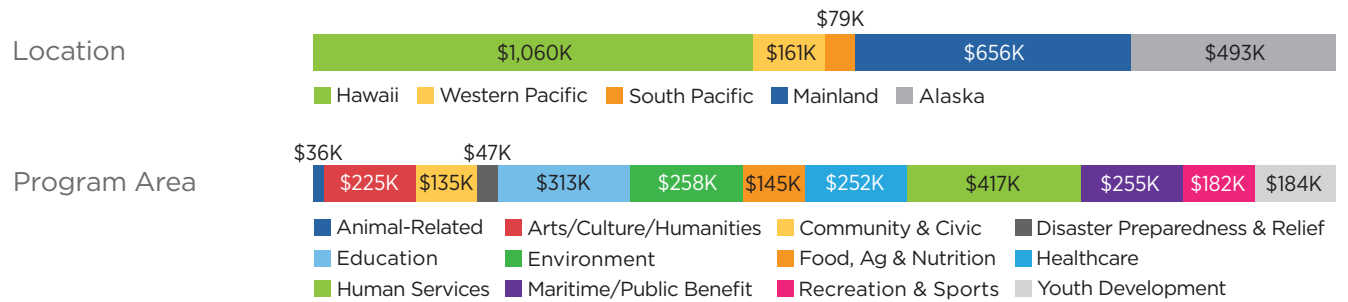
Matson provided major capital support to the Food Bank of Alaska, Girl Scout and Boy Scout camps and Punahou School in Hawaii, and the Covey Café in Anchorage.

IN-KIND SUPPORT: \$1,286,000

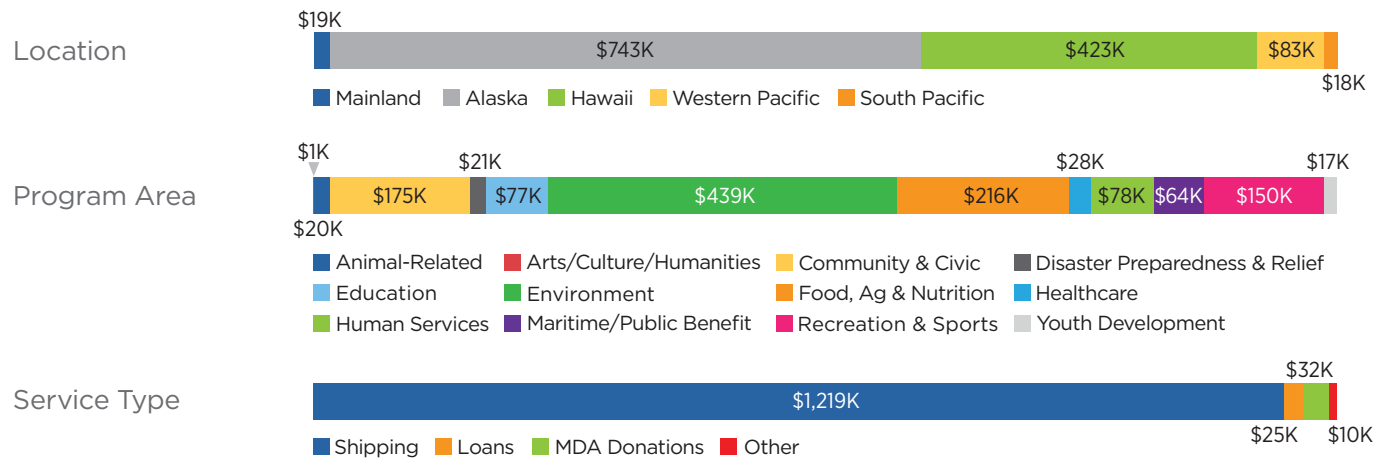
In-kind contributions comprised primarily of donated or discounted shipping for environmental programs and food banks. Loans of containers for fundraisers and donations of used containers are included. In total, Matson assisted 95 unduplicated charities.

In addition to the figure above, Matson has made future commitments of in-kind support exceeding \$300,000 in value.

IN-KIND CONTRIBUTIONS

IN KIND SUPPORT: \$1.3 Million

Matson's in-kind support was often the best option to assist the nearly twelve dozen organizations which had a variety of needs in 2019.

We loaned refrigerated containers as temporary cold storage for carnivals, fairs and fundraising events such as golf or fishing tournaments or 5K runs. We donated containers to store athletic equipment, school furnishings, agricultural tools and supplies, and equipment to battle invasive species.

Notably, our donated or discounted shipping moved donated medical equipment and supplies, schoolhouse chairs and desks, beds for the YWCA, shelf stable and perishable food that will be donated by food banks and meal programs, and youth sporting gear and uniforms. A significant donation of shipping services to Hawaii helped address our homeless crisis.

In total, Matson provided in-kind assistance for 95 separate charities.



Residents of Kahauiki Village, this mom is able to pursue her degree and continue working to support herself and son, thanks to affordable childcare available to residents of this transitional housing site. Blossoming shower trees planted among Phase 1 homes create shade around the pathway connecting homes.



At the Kahauiki Village site, these Matson containers are filled with prefabricated homes, sourced from Japan by **aio Foundation** and shipped to Oahu at no charge. The homes will be assembled on the concrete foundations which are prepared with electrical and plumbing rough-ins. Long-term affordable housing will help break the cycle of homelessness.

Detailed in this section, Matson’s cash donations around the Pacific—in Hawaii and the Western and South Pacific—totaled \$990,000, benefiting 339 different charities. (Additional cash recipients of our matching gifts, Adahi I Tano’ or Ka Ipu ‘Āina programs are found on pages 14–17.)

Matson has continued as the signature corporate sponsor of the Hawaii DOE’s Teacher Induction Center; as a top sponsor of the American Red Cross’ disaster preparedness and response in Hawaii and Guam; as underwriter of PBS Hawaii and Hawaii Public Radio’s news broadcasts; and top supporter of the USO, Navy League and Coast Guard around the Pacific.

In addition to support for hula and surfing, outrigger canoe paddling and Polynesian voyaging, we also funded rodeos and rugby, parades and plays and livestock auctions.

Matson continued our legacy of support for United Way in Hawaii and for health care at both Kapiolani and Queen’s medical centers and at REHAB Hospital.

And, we are helping celebrate the 200th anniversary of the historic Kawaiahao Church; the Centennial of the Hawaiian Civic Club of Honolulu; and our 30th year supporting the Special Olympics of Hawaii.

Project Vision’s ‘Better Vision for the Keiki’ program offers free vision screenings to Hawaii students in order to identify uncorrected vision problems that might cause students to avoid reading and fall behind in school. This group from Oahu’s Windward District jump for joy as they now see the world more clearly with their new eyeglasses, funded by this charity and its partners. Matson’s support in 2019 was an unrestricted donation.

Matson's cash donations in Alaska totaled \$474,000, not including matching gifts. During this fifth year of Giving, our support benefited 84 charities across the state—one in four of which were new to our program.

Matson provided capital support to the Food Bank of Alaska, the Alaska SeaLife Center, AWAIC and Covenant House. For the third consecutive year, Matson was lead sponsor of the Heart & Stroke Walk in Anchorage.

In addition to support for recreation—hockey, baseball and soccer, biking and running—Matson funds the (primarily indoor) performing arts. In 2019, support went to the Anchorage Concert Association, the Anchorage Symphony Orchestra and Anchorage Opera Company as well as the Alaska Youth Orchestra and Alaska Chamber Singers.

Matson's Claudia Russell donates her leadership to the **Food Bank of Alaska** as a member of their volunteer board. Her role motivates colleagues' personal donations, which Matson matches, and is another reason for Matson's support of the Food Bank's effort to purchase and furnish a larger, more efficient distribution center.

You're looking at a winning team! **The Alaska Scholastic Clay Target Program's** juniors and seniors traveled to Nebraska to bring home a high school division trophy, topping 11 other schools in the competition. It's proof that shooting is an essential outdoor skill in Alaska, for hunting and protection in the wild! Alaska SCTP supports youth to develop shooting skills along with self-reliance, personal discipline, responsibility and sportsmanship. Strong skills add to survivability in the wilderness; strong performances at competitions can lead to college scholarships, too. Matson has supported the SCTP program for the past four years.



On the island of Unalaska in the Aleutians, the **Iliuliuk Family and Health Services** clinic serves the community but many patients still need to travel to hospital, 800 air miles away in Anchorage, for diagnostic or surgical care. When weather, mechanical flight issues, or timing strand expectant mothers in Unalaska, the local nursing staff will put to use essential obstetrical and pediatric care skills gained when a Nurse Practitioner and Registered Nurse from Anchorage provided training, thanks to support from Matson.



Old Harbor is an Alutiiq village on the southeast side of Kodiak Island. Many families are sustained by subsistence hunting and fishing, while cultural and ecotourism is growing in importance. A resurgence of pride in their culture attracts these children to the Nuniaq Camp, held in July, where they learn the traditional Alutiiq dancing. Matson supported this camp, produced by **Old Harbor Native Corporation**, for the first time in 2019.



The Kodiak History Museum operates as a partnership between the **Kodiak Historical Society** and the City of Kodiak, working to preserve and share Kodiak's history. Matson's support for the Society in 2019, a first donation, was directed to updating and expanding their exhibits so that historical photos, such as this one of Kodiak island taken eighty years ago, can be preserved for future generations. 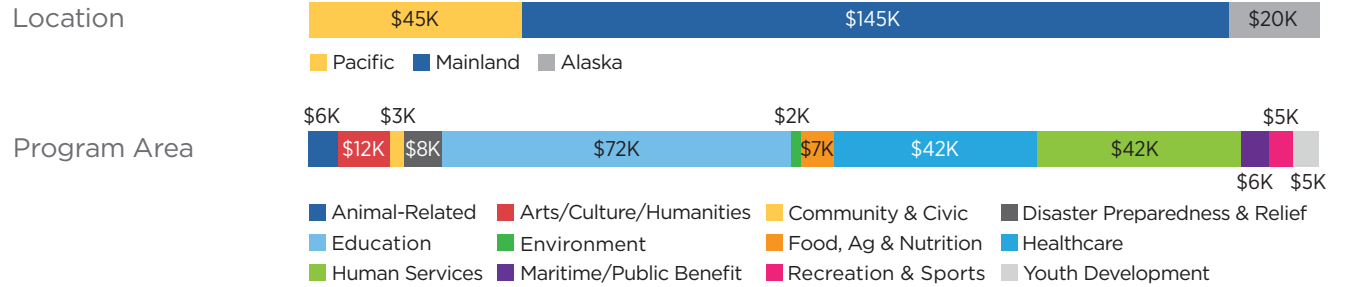

A sister program began in 2013 in Guam, where Adahi I Tano' translates to 'taking care of the land.' 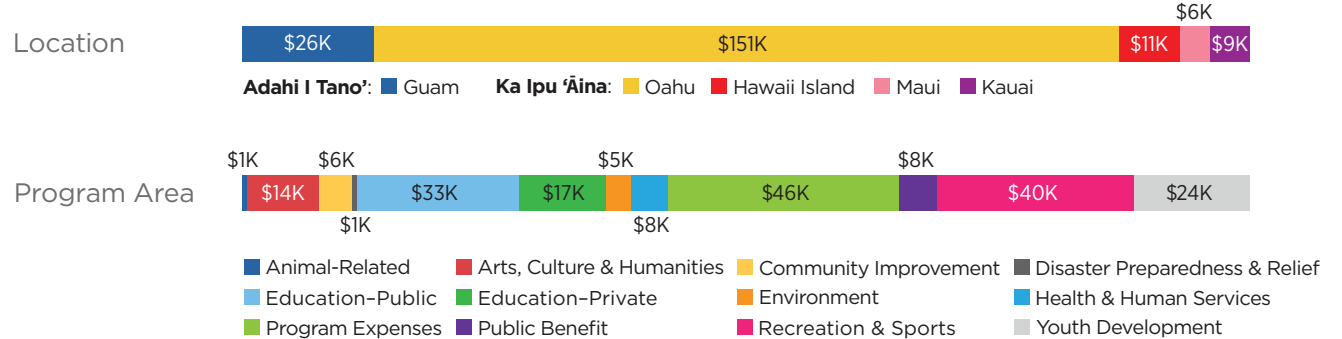

Matson makes it easy by handling the hauling and disposal of debris, leaving the volunteers without that burden just as they leave the area without rubbish. In 2019, more than \$150,000 was paid to 165 participating organizations for cleanups.
